

Maths

Year 1

We will be following the Inspire scheme of work which focuses on a CPA (concrete, pictorial, abstract) approach. We will learn to represent numbers using ten frames and use a range of manipulatives to explain our thinking.

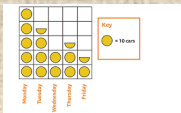
We will use the part-part-whole method and be focusing on numbers up to 10. Children will know how to record numbers as digits and words.

We will make comparative statements using sentence stems:

There are ___ birds and ___ nests. The number of birds is (fewer, more, the same as) the number of nests.

We will also look at directional language (N,S,E and W) and non-standard units of measure.

Year 2 We will begin with data handling; exploring how information can be interpreted in picture graphs.



The children will be developing their understanding of place value and learning to add and subtract numbers within 40 using different written and mental strategies.

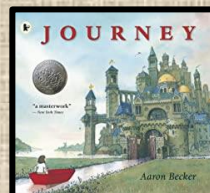
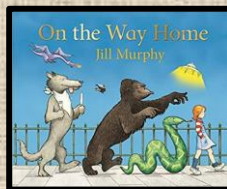
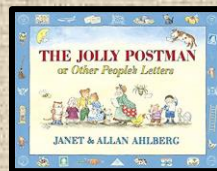
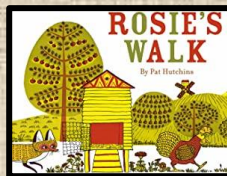
They will also solve a range of mathematical problems. We will also look at directional language (N,S,E and W) and non-standard units of measure.

English

We will continue with 'Read Write inc' four times weekly to teach and practice our understanding of phonics with a 'Let's write' every Monday morning to build our knowledge of text types and stamina for writing. Just like last year, your child will take home a book each week linked to this work. Alongside RWi, we will have our fabulous 5 books which we will share in class and will be the inspiration for different types of writing across the half term.

Through activities linked to our favourite5, the children will learn to punctuate their sentences using capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. They will also make their sentences longer by joining them with a range of conjunctions and make them more detailed using adjectives and adverbs. The year twos will also begin to organise their ideas into paragraphs.
