



### Summary Information

For the year 2020/21, our school received £16,740 in two instalments. In 2021/22 we received £16,740 in two instalments and in 2022-23 we will receive £16,650 in two instalments.

### Sports Funding expenditure

This was/will be used to:

- Employ specialist coaches to work alongside staff, for example, badminton, orienteering, cricket, dance, golf and multi skills.
- Employ staff to run inter school games to increase participation in competitive sports.
- Update and replenish resources to ensure there is a range of activities and skills that the children can participate in, both during lessons and at playtimes to increase levels of activity.
- Establish strong links with local cluster schools and within the HAT to provide joint sports activities across the school.
- Pay for transport to inter-sport events.
- Provide specialist enrichment sports weeks to inspire and enrich sporting, such as the climbing wall.
- Provide extra curricular opportunities for children, such as Tag Rugby, Running club, Table tennis etc.
- Release a member of staff to be a Sports Champion and represent the school within the HAT to enrich the sporting opportunities for our children.
- To provide coaches and lifeguards for swimming lessons

### Impact and Evaluation of expenditure

- The Sports Champion evaluates take up of sport within the school.
- Annual Questionnaires for the pupils, staff and families.

## Review

### 2020-2021

High quality coaching from county level coaches led to the selection and involvement of pupils in club level activity

25% of vulnerable children gained access to additional sport outside of school through cricket and dance.

Sports events were run in school giving access to 100% of our pupils from Early Years to Year 4. This allowed our pupils to take part in competitions alongside their peers and experience a wide range of skill development and games play.

Our children have had the opportunity to take part in a variety of enrichment sports such as Climbing Wall, Golf, seated football etc.

All our children regularly had the opportunity to work alongside trained sports coaches to develop their skills and acquisition.

All our children met an Olympic athlete and were inspired to get active.

### 2021-22

High quality coaching from county level coaches led to the selection and involvement of pupils in club level activity

All vulnerable children represented the school in a sports activity through cluster and academy events.

Sports events were run in school giving all children in Nursery – Y4 the opportunity to take part in a running festival and a dodgeball event.

All girls were involved in “girls’ football’ initiative.

Enrichment events took place – Climbing wall and

Year 3 and 4 children attended a windsurfing and paddle boarding event in Weymouth.
